Pope Francis

My dad who died some years ago, was named Thomas Francis...so I, being the first child, was named Geraldine Francis! I hated being named for two men Gerald and Francis. So I insisted on being called Gerry It worked except in Catholic school...always "Geraldine".

Some years ago, dear friends took me to Assisi in Italy and Francis took on a new admiration. I knelt by his tomb and asked him to help me be a better person of service, kindness and love. Now we have a new Pope who is commissioned to do just that.

Jorge Mario Bergoglio was born December 17, 1936 to an Italian father and a mother from Argentina who was of Italian ancestry. He is our 266th Pope who has expressed his love and care for our Benedict XVI who resigned. How beautiful to see Francis select the lower chair while visiting Benedict. Two truly humble Servants of God!

Jorge attended a technical secondary school as a chemical technician. At the age of 21 he decided to enter the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in March of 1958. He was ordained in 1969. He was eventually promoted to serve as the provincial for the Jesuits of Argentina from 1973-1979. In time he was named the Auxiliary Bishop of Buenos Aires and eventually Bishop. In 2001, he was appointed Cardinal by John Paul II and appointed to five administrative positions in the Roman Curia.

This is our new Pope...a man who is open to communion and dialogue. Here is a man who became known for personal humility, doctrinal conservatism and a strong commitment to social justice. Here is a man who values simplicity, lived in a small apartment, cooked his own meals, and used public transportation. Here is a man of Christ Jesus.

In the last Conclave he was elected to take over the heavy duties of Benedict XVI. He is the first Pope from the Western Hemisphere. The morning he walked out to the balcony to meet his people, he asked first that the congregation bless him before he blessed them. He is a man

of others...of the poor...of the physically and mentally disabled, of those judged. Was not Christ the same?

Francis values life and marriage between a man and a woman. He is a man who respects all religions including the men and women of Judaism. He is a friend to the Islamic community and promotes dialogue. In 2010, he said to the wealthy of Buenos Aires, "You avoid taking into account the poor. We have no right to duck down to lower the arms of those who are in despair. We must reclaim the memory of our country who has a mother, recover the memory of our Mother."

Francis is our Pope. He has taken the name of the joyous Francis of Assisi who was asked by God to "rebuild my Church." How blest we are! Francis, the follower of Ignatius of Loyola and Francis Xavier. He is a man of higher education, yet who does not lord his position over others.

I have already sent for newly published books on the biography of Francis our Pope. Holy cards on order for our Monastery book store. Let us pray daily for him and his predecessor. Let us thank God for the power of the Holy Spirit in guiding Pope Francis. *-Gerry Keirnan*

Yesterday, July 11, was a grand celebration of the Solemnity of St. Benedict on which we inaugurated our new canonical status as a Catholic Public Association of the Faithful of Diocesan Right, in the Diocese of Honolulu, in the Benedictine tradition. Bishop Larry Silva presided at a solemn Mass that included the installation of myself as the "Prior" for a new 4 year term and the renewal of monastic profession of our six permanent members. John is spending 3 days a week with us to help with lawn maintenance and we have volunteers coming in July and August for a few weeks each to help out wherever they can.
